Re: NCACC Position on Regulatory Reform Conference Provisions

As our members are partners with the state in implementing public policy, NCACC staff has reviewed the various proposed regulatory reform bills that moved in the 2017 long session. Counties are opposed to the following provisions of legislation currently in conference:

- **Limitations on solid waste franchising authority, specifically the ability to control solid waste flows to landfills outside the county**
- **Allowing septic systems that have gone unconstructed for almost 20 years to move forward without additional county oversight**
- **Changing the scrap tire tax rate**

In addition, NCACC requests any final legislation include a provision to create a special fund for coastal storm damage preparation and mitigation.
